## SHELTER ISLAND SEASON

Each year our *Summer Music School* students, ages 12-18, present *Works in Progress* concerts on our Shelter Island campus. These informal concerts provide students with a supportive and nurturing environment where they are free to take artistic risks without feeling the pressure associated with a formal recital. In addition, the students, faculty and fellows will present the Annual Family Concert on Sunday, July 3<sup>rd</sup>. Presented for local children and their families, this unforgettable concert experience features great music, elaborate costumes and fun skits. After the concert, students present an instrumental "petting zoo", which gives young audience members a chance to try out any of the string instruments that catch their attention during the show.

This August, young artists and artist-faculty from our *Chamber Music Workshop* will present the fifth annual *Tutti Suonare* weekend at the Old Whalers' Church in Sag Harbor and the Jewish Center of the Hamptons in East Hampton. Each concert is a special opportunity for our young artists to share the stage with their mentors and perform chamber music masterworks.

Once again, we'll extend our season through Labor Day weekend with the *Alumni Concerts Festival*. This year, three outstanding alumni will give full-length recitals on campus.

## ALUMNI CONCERTS SPRING FESTIVAL MAY 6 - 8, 2011

This spring, PMP launched a new recital program in an effort to help three alumni prepare for the *XIV International Tchaikovsky Competition* held in Russia this June. Reaching out to communities on the East End, PMP partnered with venues in Shelter Island, Greenport and East Hampton. In just three days, these musicians presented five different programs comprised of the classical masterworks required by the competition.
